FROM THE VICAR

Dear Friends,

Well, here it is - my last Magazine letter! I knew a priest once who counted down his months to retirement by the number of Parish Magazines he still had to produce! I am writing this letter the day after my last Annual General Meeting of the Parish, so the Churchwardens and Parochial Church Council are officially in place to face the coming interregnum.

It's difficult to know where to start (or finish). The last (almost) 22 years have been the most fulfilling and happy of all my ministry - in fact, that have taken up most of my ministry! Although I still consider myself very much as a 'Scouser', I have lived in Haydock longer than I have lived anywhere else in my life. So perhaps I can be considered an Honorary Yicker.

Being your Vicar has been a privilege and (mostly!) a delight. As I said last night at the AGM, St James the Great, Haydock, is a very special place. Visitors have often commented on the palpable 'holiness' of our Church, which is experienced as soon as you walk through its doors. This experience is due to the fact that the people of St James the Great, Haydock, have faithfully worshipped and prayed in this building, offering the Church's 'Sacrifice of Praise' week in, week out, and often day in and day out for over 150 years. This has produced what one priest friend called it's 'prayer-soaked walls'. For me it has been a further joy to have this wonderful building almost as a private chapel at times. It has also meant that with the Vicarage being physically attached to the Church I have often been able to pop in in my slippers (and sometimes even my dressing gown - but hopefully not many people have had to see that!).

Again, as I said at the AGM, I have every confidence for the future of our parish as it faces the interregnum. Our Church is in good health spiritually, and - thank God, financially. And we are blessed with gifted people at all levels of leadership and responsibility in our Church.

Of course, there will have to be some practical reorganization so that the various tasks required for the smooth running of the parish continue. For instance, this Magazine is a 'double issue' so as to give much time for the 'handover/take over' of its production can go as smoothly as possible. The Magazine will continue in the interregnum, and we are very pleased that David Martlew (our Reader) has offered to take on the task of its production - as well as the production of the weekly Pew Sheet. So all information / news etc. for both of these should be forwarded to him (in good time!).



As far as Memorial Donations etc. are concerned, these can still be dropped off at the Vicarage, or handed to David in Church. But please make sure they are clearly marked! Others tasks - and those responsible for them, will be made known through the Pew Sheet. Of course, the responsibility for the 'legal' administration of any parish during an interregnum falls to the Churchwardens. So please remember Phil Peplow and Nancy Holloway in your prayers in the coming months.

As it says elsewhere in this Magazine, my last Sunday as Vicar will be SUNDAY APRIL 23rd. This will be marked with a Sung Eucharist at 6pm. (just like we did when we celebrated our 150th Anniversary). There will be an 8am. Celebration on that day (but NOT one at 10am. or 11.45am!), so I hope as many of you as possible will be able to join Fr Robin and I in the evening as we celebrate the end of our ministries amongst you.

My Licensing at Denia in Spain will take place on Monday June 12th. at 12 noon, but my first 'Sunday Duty' will be on May 14th.
